### CCCC BOARD OF REGENTS





CCCC is chartered by the Spirit Lake Tribe, with a five member Board of Regents appointed by the Tribal Council to serve three-year terms. The Board of Regents is empowered, to grant degrees to qualified applicants upon the completion of the approved curriculum. The Board of Regents formulates and implements policies and procedures for the operation of the institution. Three of the five members are CCCC graduates; all have bachelors degree. Mr. Lohnes has a masters.

## **CCCC HEAD START NOTES**

CCCC Head Start is headquartered in a centrally located facility on the Spirit Lake Dakota reservation. The building's total square footage is 40,944. The building consists of 19 classrooms, a nurse's station, administrative offices, a home-based meeting area, a heated bus garage, a multi-purpose room, a conference room, a staff lounge and a kitchen facility. The facility provides center-based services for Early Head Start and Head Start programs plus a Home-Based outreach program.

CCCC Head Start is a school readiness program. The staff utilize the evidence based *Creative Curriculum®* which includes ten areas of development and learning. The program is also does Dakota Language and cultral diversity educational experiences for the children.

**Eric Rogness**CCCC Faculty of the Year




**Ann Wadsworth** CCCC Employee of the Year




**Noelle Dauphinais** CCCC Employee of the Year





#### **CCCC 5-Year Enrollment by Semester**









#### Total Enrollment and Full-Time Equivalent


1 FTE=12 enrolled credit hours (based on full-time student taking 12 or more credits)




#### Fall Enrollment by Native American/Spirit Lake/Non-Native



#### Fall Enrollment by Gender




### Fall Enrollment by Full-Time/ Part-Time



#### **First Time Students**


Students in their first semester of college plus high school students previously enrolled in dual-credit/early entry courses in their first semester after high school.
